Luke 4:18a (NIV) "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to


















Matthew 11:4 (ESV) And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see:



1 Samuel 17:52 (NIV) Then the men of Israel and Judah surged forward with a shout and pursued the Philistines to the entrance of Gath and to the gates of Ekron. Their dead were strewn along the Shaaraim road to Gath and Ekron.



2 Samuel 21:19 (NIV) In another battle with the Philistines at Gob, Elhanan son of Jair the Bethlehemite killed the brother of Goliath the Gittite, who had a spear with a shaft like a weaver's roc.



2 Samuel 21:20 (NIV) In still another battle, which took place at Gath, there was a huge man with six fingers on each hand and six toes on each foottwenty-four in all. He also was descended from Rapha.




2 Samuel 21:21 (NIV) When he taunted srael, Jonathan son of Shimeah, David's brother, kiled him.




3. It's Your Pastor's responsibility to provide you a vision so what you see changes.


Mark 14:4 (NIV) Some of those present were saying indignantly to one another, "Why this waste of perfume?
