**19. Dear friends, never take  
revenge. Leave that to the  
righteous anger of God. For the  
Scriptures say, "I will take  
revenge; I will pay them back,"  
says the LORD.**

**20. Instead, “If your enemies are hungry, feed them. If they are thirsty, give them something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals of shame on their heads.”**

## **Paul, Onesimus, and Philemon**



**Philemon 1:8 (NIV)**

**Paul's Plea for Onesimus**

**Therefore, although in Christ  
I could be bold and order you  
to do what you ought to do,**

# Philemon 1:9 (NIV)

yet I prefer to appeal to you  
on the basis of love. It is as  
none other than Paul—an old  
man and now also a prisoner  
of Christ Jesus—

**Philemon 1:10 (NIV)**  
**that I appeal to you for**  
**my son Onesimus, who**  
**became my son while I**  
**was in chains.**

**Philemon 1:11 (NIV)**

**Formerly he was useless  
to you, but now he has  
become useful both to  
you and to me.**

**Philemon 1:12 (NIV)**

**I am sending him—  
who is my very heart—  
back to you.**

# **Philemon 1:13 (NIV)**

**I would have liked to keep him with me so that he could take your place in helping me while I am in chains for the gospel.**

**Philemon 1:14 (NIV)**

**But I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that any favor you do would not seem forced but would be voluntary.**

# Philemon 1:15 (NIV)

Perhaps the reason he was  
separated from you for a  
little while was that you  
might have him back  
forever—



# **Philemon 1:16 (NIV)**

**no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a fellow man and as a brother in the Lord.**

**Philemon 1:17 (NIV)**

**So if you consider me a partner, welcome him as you would welcome me.**

**Philemon 1:18 (NIV)**

**If he has done you any  
wrong or owes you  
anything, charge it to  
me.**

# **Philemon 1:19 (NIV)**

**I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand. I will pay it back—not to mention that you owe me your very self.**

have been forgiven  
many many times by  
Him**
